8. REPORT FOR DECISION – EGRESS FROM CORNWALL CRESCENT

Recommendation

That the committee decides if it wishes to endorse a request for double yellow lines adjacent to the entrance to Cornwall Crescent.

Purpose of the Report

To determine how it wishes to respond to a request for double yellow lines adjacent to the entrance to Cornwall Crescent.

Background

Officers have received a letter from a resident of Cornwall Crescent (Doc 8/1), who is concerned that the lack of parking restrictions around the entrance to Cornwall Crescent is resulting in a significant risk of an accident.

In his letter, the resident is asking that double yellow lines are installed and be considered for both sides of the entrance to Cornwall Crescent.

Whilst the decision to install double yellow lines is ultimately for the Community Area Transport Group to make, it will not consider such a request from the community unless it is endorsed by the Town or Parish Council and funding is offered in the region of 25% to 50% of the cost.

Options Considered

The Committee needs to decide if it wishes to support the request.

Implications and Risks

Financial and Resource Implications

CATG will expect a financial contribution, should the Town Council request the installation of double yellow lines and should that requested be supported by the highway engineer.

Currently no specific budget is held for this purpose.

Legal Implications and Legislative Powers

The Council will be considering this matter under its General Power of Competence.

Environmental Implications

Officers are unaware of any environmental implication for the Council associated with this decision.

Risk Assessment

Officers are unaware of any risk implication for the Council associated with this decision.

Crime and Disorder

Officers are not aware of any issues the Council should consider under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder act 1998.
